## LOCAL REFUSE TIPS

### Will you Pay to Dump Your Waste?

#### **Bucks County Council consulting on 'realistic' options to make household recycling centres affordable.**

An eight week consultation has started to hear the public's views on a series of proposed cost-saving and future growth measures to make the County's household recycling centres (local tips) affordable in the future. The County Council is having to reduce costs across all its services as funding reductions in the public sector continue to bite. Buckinghamshire has a much higher number of sites serving its population. In addition, centres currently take certain waste like rubble, soil, plasterboard and car tyres for free where other Councils make a variety of disposal charges.

**Bucks County Council are proposing to introduce charging at all sites for specific waste that they don't legally have to accept for free.**

County Council Cabinet Member for Planning and Environment, Bill Chapple said the review was a 'reluctant but necessary step'. He said: "We have an extremely tough budget to meet from April 2019 onwards and this means facing up to some difficult decisions. There definitely needs to be changes, but my overall aim is to retain a service that still works for the majority of people going forward. I completely understand that people don't like being faced with extra charges. However, I have taken into account the fact that less than a third of waste falls into this category, so the charges won't affect everyone and it also brings us into line with what other Councils do. Of course, there are other areas where we have genuine choice and that's where an open and honest consultation is so important. For example, we're looking for views on which two weekdays people would prefer Burnham (if this site remains open), Chesham and Aylesbury (Rabans Lane) to be closed, and also what Buckinghamshire residents think about people from outside the county using our recycling centres which is, of course, an extra cost to local county taxpayers."

**The consultation runs until midnight on Monday, October 22.**

### **Dinton Village Hall Oak Tree**

At the Silver Jubilee of George V in 1935, Sir William Currie planted an oak tree in the grounds of Dinton Village Hall.

He passed the responsibility of its well being to the Parish Council in the form of a handwritten note which we have. In 1953, at the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, the Parish Council organised a sub-committee to decide the best way to celebrate the occasion. One idea was to plant a tree and this is documented in the Bucks Herald dated 13<sup>th</sup> February, 1953. There is a damaged sign which was removed from the oak tree which says "Planted to commemorate the Coronation of HM Queen Elizabeth II, 1953". We don't know if the tree was planted in 1935 or 1953. It may have been planted in 1935 and replaced in 1953. However, it is a magnificent example of an oak tree and was planted in Dinton to celebrate an important Royal occasion.

## IS YOUR BIN DAY CHANGING?

Residents in Aylesbury Vale are advised to look out for a letter from Aylesbury Vale District Council, arriving this week.

The letter explains the upcoming new bin collection schedules and changes to the recycling and waste service, and contains a new bin collection calendar to help clarify the change.

The letter will advise and inform of the changes to each household's recycling and waste collection service, starting the week beginning Monday, 3rd September. For some, these changes will result in a new bin collection day, while others may not see any change at all.

Changes are being made to collection routes to ensure the service is efficient, provides value for money and takes into account new housing developments in the county. Collection times may also vary due to route changes, so bins must now be left out by 6.30am on the relevant day.

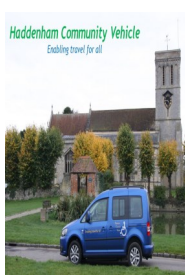
