Harry served the Church faithfully for many years, looking after and sorting out the promised giving. Many people told me that they thought Harry was a real "Gentleman". Churchwarden, David John who has worked for a long time with him and said the following:-

"Harry was a nice man. He was the administrator for the free will offering scheme, doing the returns for tax purposes. We worked together three or four times a year. If I had any problems he would help me, and he taught me quite a lot.

In the last few years there has been a great change in the way taxes are claimed back and this made it more difficult for him. He had great patience and determination in solving all the problems".

Many of us will miss Harry, not least his wife Brenda and daughters Penny and Amanda.

We all pray that he will Rest in Peace and Rise in Glory.

Having served 2 years National Service aged 18 he went back to being a baker at Dinton Bakery until they closed. He began working at St. Johns Hospital managing the stores for about 20 years. On retiring he continued to live in Upton with his sister Ida and Ron Simmonds and their family. After Ida died Fred went to live at Woodlands in Haddenham where he settled happy and contented joining in all their activities and made many friends.

Fred was a very sociable person played dominoes, crib and whist drives in Dinton for many years. He especially enjoyed going horse racing and was a familiar face at many race courses. He also enjoyed a good party and dancing.



January Gardening

January is the principle month for planning and buying seeds and plants, and to decide to correct any mistakes with varieties grown last year. Inspect all stored tubers, vegetables and any other plant material to ensure it is not going bad. Also be on the lookout for mice as there seem to be lots of them about. Still time to plant trees and shrubs, make sure the soil is in good condition and all plants and firmed in and trees well staked.

Complete fruit tree pruning unless it is too frosty. Rhubarb can be encouraged to fruit earlier, that is if you like rhubarb, by covering some crowns with buckets or tubs.

Growers of potatoes should put the seed potatoes into trays for sprouting and set them in a light, frost free place to grow strong shoots ready for planting out later.

Last January, I'm sure you remember was very, very wet. 5.7 inches in this area, against an average of just over two and a half inches, during the last 30 years, but of course it was a lot warmer. Hope it is dryer this year.

The Mission of the Seventy

After this the Lord appointed seventy others and sent them on ahead of him in pairs to every town and place where he himself intended to go. He said to them, "The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest. Go on your way. See, I am sending you out like lambs into the midst of wolves. Carry no purse, no bag, no sandals; and greet no one on the road. Whatever house you enter, first say, 'Peace to this house!' And if anyone is there who shares in peace, your peace will rest on that person; but if not, it will return to you. Remain in the same house, eating and drinking whatever they provide, for the labourer deserves to be paid. Do not move about from house to house. Whenever you enter a town and its people welcome you, eat what is set before you; cure the sick who are there, and say to them, 'The kingdom of God has come near to you. But whenever you enter a town and they do not welcome you, go out into its streets and say, 'Even the dust of your town that clings to our feet, we wipe off in protest against you. Yet know this: the kingdom of God has come near. 'I tell you, on that day it will be more tolerable for Sodom than for that town. **Luke 10:1-12 New Revised Standard Version**

A very happy and joyful New Year to you all.








