St John and the Steps

There is a theory that churches dedicated to John the Baptist have steps from the door going down into the church and these signify Jesus descending into the river Jordan where He was baptised. It may be just a quaint story but some churches do have steps down as you go in.

One such church is St John the Baptist's church, Great Gaddesden, Herts. The website states, 'As you enter from the porch you step down into the church; this is often a feature of churches dedicated to St John the Baptist, as Jesus Christ stepped down into the River Jordan to be baptised.' The same claim is made on the website of Widford church, also in Hertfordshire.

SS Peter and Paul in Dinton has steps going up into the church and St John the Baptist Stone does have the opposite.

The ground levels around churches alter over centuries and the story may just be a clever story to explain this. It is quite a good story.

Letter from Aston Sandford

22nd June 1946 – 12th July 2025

Marilynne Ann Morgan C.B.



I can hardly believe it that almost a year has passed since 12th July 2025 when Marilynne died here in our house, after her struggles with the months of aggressive cancer that took her life away.

She was born in Oxford but soon moved to Strood in Kent where she grew up. Schooled from 4-18 at Gads Hill Place School where Charles Dickens had lived and written many of his novels.

She then went to Bedford College in London to read History, having been told that reading law was too boring. I met her at a party, and we dated for a number of years as we started our careers. She was taken on in 1967 as a Researcher Assistant, Special Historical Section of the FCO – not as a spy as a lot of friends thought.

In 1970 we married in Rochester Cathedral and had our honeymoon at my parents' cottage in France, thus starting our long enjoyment of "France Profund".

Marilynne decided that a career in the FCO was not for her and that the law would be a better choice, but she liked the spirit of the Civil Service as a working environment. She undertook a law conversion course, the final year of which had to be done full time. She was called by Middle Temple in 1972.

She passed out almost at the top of her year and gained a pupillage but quickly decided that the life of a jobbing barrister was not for her. She applied to join the Civil Service Law team in the Dept. of Health and Social Security (or as it was known Dept. of Stealth and Total Obscurity) as a legal Assistant in 1973. She steadily worked her way up the department.

She was promoted to Senior Legal Assistant 1978, to Assistant Solicitor in 1982 then Under Sec and Principal Solicitor 1985-1991. In 1991 she transferred to the Department of the Environment and became their Solicitor and Legal Advisor in 1992. She became then Chairman, Departmental Task Force in 1994 and Senior Director Legal and Corporate Services Group 1996-1997.

She then moved back to the Department for Work and Pensions (formerly DHSS) as Director-General of the Law and Special Policy Group. In this role, she was one of the most senior civil servants reporting directly to the Permanent Secretary, in the largest UK government department with over 100,000 employees at the time. She retired from the department in 2004.

She became a Non-Exec Director at Treasury Solicitors 2004 – 2010 and she was appointed a Companion of the Most Honourable Order of the Bath (C.B.) in 1996, one of the United Kingdom's most senior orders of chivalry.

Her other activities included:-

Legal Advisor to the Civil Service Sports Council and Chair of the Appointments Committee.

Vice Chairman 1983-1984 then Chairman 1984-1986 Legal Section of Assn of First Division Civil Servants.

Trustee/Director Alzheimers' Society 2003 – 9.

Alzheimers' Brain Bank UK 2005 – 2011.

Ambashe Orchestra 2003 – 2006.

At Middle Temple Master Marilynne Morgan was elected a Bencher in 2002. She sat on the Executive, Estates, Wine, Finance and Catering Committees and was a Trustee of the Scholarship Funds. She was Lent Reader in 2012 and served as Master of the Kitchen.

Member General Council of the Bar 1987-1992.

Contributor Halsbury's Laws of England 1982, 1986.

She was Chairman of The Friends of Buckinghamshire's Historic Churches and a Trustee of their Trust. She was Chairman of Trustees, University Women's Club. She was elected Treasurer of our PCC and served in that role for 31 years. She started the "Letter from Aston Sanford" article in this magazine many years ago and it is a tradition that we aim to keep going with other members of our congregation generating it in future.

In 1983 my job moved from London to Witney, which forced us to move house. Our plans were originally to stay closer to London but on a wet May bank holiday we looked at a house in Aston Sandford, just viewing it from the road, and after visiting it the following weekend made an offer for it and moved into it that August. A decision that neither of us ever regretted making.

In their wisdom, Church leaders have designated the weeks between Pentecost and the Feast of Christ the King [on the Sunday before Advent] as **Ordinary Time**; that is no less than thirty-three weeks! Thirty-three weeks out of the year's total of fifty-two, a sizeable proportion.

Thinking about this, it occurs to me that this is probably much like our own lives – a number of high days and holidays, but a large proportion of so-called 'ordinary time.'

We enjoy the special occasions, both national and personal. Remember the street parties and neighbourhood get-togethers celebrating the late Queen's Jubilees, then the King's Coronation? We celebrate family weddings and anniversaries and babies' births. These are all undoubtedly Special Days.

But what about the other days and weeks? What about the days when you wake up to the sun shining from a cloudless sky and the washing blows happily dry? What about the days everything goes well at work, you catch up with all the emails and get a beaming 'thank you' from the boss. What about....oh, well, you name it! They're special days too, aren't they? Not ordinary at all.

The Church says that 'officially' those thirty-three Sundays leading up to the Sunday before Advent, are 'Ordinary Time'. I would like to dispute that! On each of those Sundays millions of Christians world wide are worshipping God; some in grand and beautiful ancient churches, some in plain and simple Chapels, some in home groups, some in the open air. Many worship in secret and fear, but all celebrate the loving God who sent His Son to redeem and save humankind. That's not 'ordinary' – that's SPECIAL.

Cuddington School News

It really does seem no time at all since returning after the Easter break, and May has already been full of activity and opportunity for the children across both sites. We have quickly settled back into the rhythm of school life, and it has been wonderful to see the children so engaged in their learning both inside and outside the classroom. The recent spell of good weather has helped us make the most of our outdoor spaces, with pupils enjoying Outdoor Days and continuing to benefit from our Forest School provision. These provided valuable opportunities for exploration, teamwork and creativity beyond the classroom and the children embraced them with enthusiasm.



It has also been a busy time for sport and enrichment. Our Year 5 and 6 pupils have represented the school brilliantly at both a Hockey Festival and a Tennis Tournament, showing not only skill but also great sportsmanship and resilience. We are always proud of the way our children conduct themselves when out in the community and these events were no exception. A particular highlight of the month was the Year 5 and 6 visit to Eythrope for a river study fieldtrip. The children gained hands-on experience to support their learning in geography and science, deepening their understanding of the natural environment. Opportunities such as these really bring learning to life and help to develop curiosity and independence.

In the classroom, the children have continued to work hard. Year 6 approached their SATs with an exemplary attitude, with some even commenting on how much they had enjoyed the experience as they completed their final test. We have also seen fantastic initiative from pupils with the continuation of our pupil-led Science Club, giving children the opportunity to lead their own investigations and share their curiosity with others. Creativity and performance have also played a central role this half term. Some of our pupils were fortunate enough to take part in the ECHOES performance at the Royal Albert Hall, which was an unforgettable experience for all involved. Back at the infant site, we enjoyed our traditional Cuddington Summer Dancing, and handing out of flowers, a lovely celebration that brings together children, staff and the wider community.

Our commitment to developing the whole child continues to be central to all we do. The OPAL Parent Workshop on play and childhood provided valuable insight into the importance of play in children's development and was very well received by families. It is always a pleasure to work in partnership with parents to support the children's wellbeing and learning. We greatly value the importance of working closely in partnership with parents and carers and the community; this support, engagement and communication are vital in helping us to provide the very best experiences for every child, and we are extremely grateful for the continued collaboration between home and school and our local villages.
